ADVOCACY OPERATIONS The Bilderberg Group Backs Turkish Membership in EU

The discreet Bilderberg Group, which has worked since 1954 to forge stronger bonds between the United States and Europe, met rather significantly this year in Istanbul, Turkey's economic capital, between May 31-June 3. Each time the Bilderberg group gathers rumours tend to swirl around the participants and the subjects they discussed. Intelligence Online has obtained the official list of those attending the Istanbul encounter (see graph below). Turkey was heavily represented with 12 participants but that is customary with a host country, whose major corporations usually finance the meeting. But it could be considered that in staging the gathering in Istanbul the Bilderberg group - which represents a good part of the financial, political and intellectual elite on both sides of the Atlantic- signalled that it was strongly backing Turkish membership in the European Union.
